On November 12, 2025, the District Board of Directors approved a rate increase to cover the rising costs for water production and wastewater treatment. This is required to provide the same level of service to its customers. The last rate change occurred in November 2022. This letter is to inform all our customers that effective with the January 1, 2026, billing cycle the District's rates will increase. A summary of the previous and amended rates are shown below for residential with commercial on back. Municipal services such as trash or waste disposal are set by that City or entity and are not included in this rate amendment.
